# NEW: Work Star (3rd Edition)

Introducing the new and improved Star to practitioners

Following the publication of the original editions of the Work Star in 2010, Triangle have collected feedback from service users, practitioners, and managers about which elements of the Star work well and which could be improved to work better. In 2015-16 Triangle collaborated with a group of services using the Work Star to develop a new and improved 3rd Edition.

# What has changed in the new Edition?

Triangle have created new supporting materials, tightened up descriptions and statements across all seven scales, and clarified the Journey of Change stage names (while retaining the original meaning of each stage).

We have also **replaced the "Challenges" scale** with a new scale called "**Health & Well-being**" creating a clearer focus around physical and mental health and removing any confusion with the "Stability" scale.

We have renamed "Job-specific skills" to "Job skills and experience" to ensure experience is considered alongside training and qualifications.

# What do I need to do?

If you have been provided with the materials for the new Edition, make sure you familiarise yourself with the new scales, new descriptors and new Journey of Change stages.

Discuss it with your colleagues and **try it out** before using it with the service users that you support.
